

Dear Mayor & Council:

Re: **Community Wildlife Monitoring Program- Phase 1**

Background of the project:

This project connects local biologists with local students. The biologists will be passing on skills and knowledge to students from our Biology 11 and Sustainability 12 classes. They will work with the students in classroom and field settings to learn about local wildlife activity together.

We will set up cameras to track wildlife activity in the forested area behind the school in February. The cameras will be installed along a well-known wildlife corridor that runs through the middle of our community. The students will be taught about wildlife safety and follow wildlife safety protocols when in the field. The students will be taught how to collect and analyze data collected from the cameras, and help develop scientific protocols specific to this project. They will then practice their technical skills through weekly data collection and analysis sessions. In June the students and biologists will complete a report and presentation of their findings.

In addition to the field aspects of the project, the biologists will deliver 2 classroom presentations that will introduce students and teachers to local research on wildlife and people accessible in the WildCoast Primer.

There is hope that Feb-June 2015 is only the first phase of this project and that it will become a longer term project to help track wildlife activity over the course of the year (or multiple years).

Request #1:

We are requesting permission to set up our cameras on property owned by the District of Ucluelet for this project. It is the wooded area behind the school fields

Request #2

We need to purchase three heat/motion sensor cameras with protective security casings and SIM cards valued at \$800 each. We are hoping that the District of Ucluelet may want to help out by covering the cost of one of these cameras. For this project we are looking for an \$800 donation.

The organizations or businesses who purchase cameras for us will get acknowledgment on our website, in the local newspaper, and acknowledged on the camera casing so anyone passing by would be notified that your business bought the camera for the program.

If you require more information about the project please contact me. We look forward to working with the District of Ucluelet on this project.
