3 PUBLIC INPUT AND PRESENTATIONS

- 3.1 DELEGATION re: Commercial Moorage at Small Craft Harbour Joe Atkinson, Strata President Waters Edge
 - The Harbour Authority received a verbal presentation regarding concerns for residents at Waters Edge Condominiums as pertains to: plans for the commercial fishing docks, bylaws and enforcement in place to monitor noise and pollution at the harbour, protected views under the Official Community Plan becoming obstructed once expansion is complete, and the desire for consultation with stakeholder residents
 - The Harbour Authority responded that a report would be prepared to answer Mr. Atkinson's questions; the Harbour Authority explained that the District of Ucluelet's leases the harbour from the federal government whose priority is servicing the commercial fishing fleet; the Harbour Authority noted that municipal bylaws cannot supercede federal regulations, and that the Harbour Authority's next meeting with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans would likely be in January 2017

3.2 PUBLIC INPUT

- G. Taylor inquired how the expansion project arose (whether Ucluelet-initiated or federally-initiated) and why stakeholders in immediate area were not consulted; Mr. Taylor commented that he is invested in a tourism-based business and there needs to be a preservation of a tourism core that will not be impacted by the commercial fishing industry
- The Harbour Authority provided that the expansion is driven by the federal government and that Ucluelet is the top landing port in British Columbia for fish landed

5.2 General Discussion

The Harbour Authority engaged in open discussion, with a summary of points made as follows:

- Currently no access to breakwater from land; might be possible to re-use Canadian Princess ramps to bridge the gap, but would have to remove and re-drive pilings to secure it; suggested to look at gangways when they're removed to determine if they could be useful
- Inquired if stairs to the current wharf would be of use; looking to reuse and recycle wherever possible; Oak Bay is removing everything in one go to make it ready for new owner
- Harbour Authority will meet with DFO in January; to-date,
 Harbour Authority is displeased with change in configuration but won't know what Ucluelet will need until work is complete
- Encourage people to access minutes of Harbour Advisory Commission or go to those meetings to make comment
- Still waiting for timeframe and information on when Ucluelet can leverage the million-dollar investment by DFO for grant opportunities
- Canadian Princess due to be removed September 30 at 11:00am; believe that there are no costs to the District, as DFO is paying to facilitate the egress
- Question of whether Council should budget for a potential car ferry terminal in 2017, and whether District staff would be involved; still early days
