1 CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 PM.

2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF FIRST NATIONS TERRITORY

The Harbour Authority acknowledged the Yuułuʔiłʔatḥ, on whose traditional territories the District of Ucluelet operates.

5 APPROVAL OF AGENDA

5.1 March 30, 2023, Regular Harbour Authority Agenda

8 REPORTS

8.1 Harbour Improvements Director Maftei

Director Maftei presented. He noted that he is a Harbour user, and many issues identified in the report are common to other users.

The Harbour Manager addressed each issue identified in the report as follows:

- Year-round water supply: Bleeder valves could be installed on the water lines to provide water throughout the winter.
- Power at 52 Steps Dock: Since this is a Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) - Small Craft Harbour facility, DFO approval is required to install power. A cost estimate should be obtained first. The District could request DFO fund part or all of this project.
- <u>Prioritization of annual moorage users</u>: Harbour Authority could adopt a policy to address this issue.
- <u>Dock space allocation prioritization for seasonal users and</u>
 <u>related fee structures</u>: Harbour Authority could adopt policy and
 recommend bylaw amendments to address these issues.
- Moorage/enforcement policies for derelict vessels: The Harbour Manager works with vessel owners to achieve compliance. If compliance is not achieved, vessels in arears are dealt with in accordance with the Warehouse Lein Act and derelict vessels are dealt with through DFO's Vessels of Concern Program.
- <u>Washroom improvements</u>: Could be a future budget item for the Harbour Authority to consider.

Staff clarified that water supply is metered, and recommended a report be prepared to determine if these are Harbour Authority priority items, before public input is solicited.

2023.2025.HA

It was moved and seconded **THAT** the Harbour Authority direct Staff to investigate and provide a report back to the Harbour Authority on the following topics:

- 1. Insulation of water lines to allow for year-round supply of water;
- 2. Installation of power at 52 Steps;
- 3. Prioritization of annual moorage users;
- 4. Dock space allocation prioritization for seasonal users and related fee structure;
- 5. Moorage/enforcement policies and priorities with respect to derelict vessels; and
- 6. Washroom, Laundry and Shower Facility upgrades and access options.

8.2 Sublease Barkley Sound Adventure Centre Abby Fortune, Director of Recreation

Ms. Fortune presented this report. She noted that the harbour head lease expired in 2022 and therefore overholding provisions apply. Ms. Fortune outlined the process associated with entering into a sublease of harbour facilities.

The owner of Barkley Sound Adventure Centre Inc. noted concerns with delays in obtaining a lease agreement with the District for the Floathouse Patio & Grill and Adventure Centre.

It was moved and seconded **THAT** the Harbour Authority approve the Barkley Sound Adventure Centre Inc. to operate the Floathouse Patio & Grill and Adventure Centre within the Ucluelet Inner Boat Basin at 200 Hemlock Street Ucluelet, British Columbia.

It was moved and seconded **THAT** the Harbour Authority approve the sublease as presented in the March 30, 2023 report to the Harbour Authority between the District of Ucluelet and the Barkley Sound Adventure Centre Inc. for the operation of the Floathouse Restaurant and Adventure Centre in a sublease amount of \$15,445 for 2023 plus gst, excluding utilities, with an annual increase 5 % for the term of four years commencing January 4, 2023 through January 3, 2027 totaling \$66,569 plus gst.

It was moved and seconded **THAT** the Harbour Authority authorize staff to issue a letter to the Department of Fisheries and Oceans - Small Craft Harbour, indicating the Harbour Authority approval of the Barkley Sound Adventure Centre Inc. business operations within the Ucluelet Inner Boat Basin and support the execution of a sublease between District of Ucluelet and the Barkley Sound Adventure Centre Inc.
